

QUICK GUIDE TO INTERCLUB MATCHES

For more information please read the full interclub rules in this Handbook.

TNR Senior Interclub Rules 2023/24 page 35

- 1) Each captain/manager should fill in his/her team in full (First name and Surname) correctly, before copying the opposition team into their interclub booklet - prior to the start of the first match.
- Double check your draw prior to your match to confirm venue as this may be changed at anytime due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All matches should start at the time indicated on the draw. Teams should arrive 15 minutes early to warm-up (off court, if the courts are in use) and be ready to play at the allocated time. In Senior Singles match, captains can arrange a time later than the scheduled time of 6pm if 3 courts are allocated. Captains must contact each other in advance and ensure all players are informed. Please be flexible and accommodating.
- 4) If a playing order for matches cannot be agreed, the order stated in the rules must be followed. Teams should do their best to accommodate each other and play within the spirit of the game.
- 5) All players must wear attire that allows ball storage whilst serving.
- 6) The interval between the 1st & 2nd matches on a particular court should not exceed five minutes including the hit-up which is limited to three minutes. Where a player who has just completed a match and is immediately required for another, the interval between matches must not exceed 10 minutes, including the 3-minute hit up.
- The latest finishing time will vary with each venue. Players should respect venue rules, particularly in regard to light restrictions. Every endeavour must be made to complete all matches on time.
- 8) Any matches not completed on a given day must be completed as soon as possible at a time arranged by the Team Captains/Managers. They may be played at the Albany Tennis Park, Forrest Hill or on club courts. To book Albany Tennis Park or Forrest Hill courts e-mail admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz.
- 9) It is the responsibility of ALL TEAMS scheduled at the Forrest Hill facility to ensure it is locked and closed down correctly each evening. Refer to page 14 Looking After Your Tennis Centre at Forrest Hill.
- 10) Only those courts assigned on the draw should be used as vacant courts may be booked by another group. Please check vacant court availability before use.
- 11) It is recommended that valuable items be taken onto court by players rather than leaving them in cars.
- 12) Avoid defaulting matches. In Senior Interclub there is a penalty. In Junior Interclub, no penalty is in place but a default is very disappointing for the opposing team. A 'no show' is rude behaviour


How do I find out my interclub draw?

- 1. Go to www.tennisnorthern.co.nz.
- 2. Click on Interclub Links. (Right side of home page)
- 3. Click on Senior Interclub Draws and Points Table.
- 4. Find your grade and click on the appropriate link.
- 5. You must check the website regularly for changes to your draw i.e. the night before you play. Tell ALL your team members to do the same so they are aware of any changes.

How do I enter my team's interclub results?

If you are the winning team you must enter your results into Match Hub Rankings within 48 hours of the game being played. However any player (from either the winning or losing team) who has been listed as an interclub recorder can enter the result. To be listed as an interclub recorder your email address must be listed under your Match Hub Rankings code on the Match Hub Rankings system.

- Connect to the Internet.
- 2. Go to www.tennis.org.nz/resultslogin.asp or www.tennisnorthern.co.nz. and scroll down the page to find the login link.
- 3. You will see a Login window. Enter your Match Hub Rankings player code and password and click Login. If you do not have a password, or have forgotten it, then click the Request New Password button. If an error message appears please email admin@tennisnorthern. co.nz with your player code, name of team and club as your email address is either missing or incorrect on the Match Hub Rankings system.
- 4. After logging in you must select the Competition, the Grade, then Interclub Round Number and opposition team from the drop down list. Click the capture result button.
- 5. Next you will see the Interclub Results window. Enter your match results. There is a Help button that provides instructions. Once entered, click the update button to submit the results.
 - If it is a draw, please manually enter the total sets won by each team. If this is even, then enter total games won for each team. Any errors will be highlighted in red. If you cannot find a player, or have any problems that you cannot fix, then write a note for the administrator in the box at the bottom of the screen then click the update button. The results will be saved even if they are incomplete or have errors. After completing the results click the Exit button. The administrator will adjust point calculations if required.
- 7. Use the Display Points Table button to see the current standings and review any match result. You may see 0-0 on the table if you entered a draw result. The points will be allocated by the administrator.

I requested a password but it says my email is not registered?

This means that for some reason your email is not in the system. How to register your email: send an email to admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz and ask for your email to be registered for Match Hub Rankings. You will need to say which club and team you play for.

I requested a password but it has not arrived in my inbox?

If the email address you registered is a hotmail, gmail, yahoo or similar account the response from Match Hub Rankings may be sitting in your Junk Mail Inbox. If you still can't find the password, your address in the system may be wrong. Please contact admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz to have it corrected or updated.

Our opposition defaulted but we have not been awarded any points?

Senior and Junior Interclub default points are based on your team's average for the season and they can only be calculated once all matches have been played, at the end of the season. If a Senior team defaults a match the club will be fined and if the team defaults a third time they will lose their position in that grade for the rest of the season.

Do I have to enter the results every week? And can someone else from my team enter them?

It is the responsibility of the winning team to enter the results, but if you notice the result is missing, you (as the losing captain/manager) can still enter that result. If you would like someone else to enter the results you will need to give them your code and password or email admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz to have their email address linked to your Match Hub Rankings code. They will then have to request another password. All players with their email attached to their Match Hub Rankings code will be able to record results for the team in which they play.

You cannot use your player code to enter results for teams which you do not play for.

I can't find a player in our team or the other team?

If the player you are looking for does not appear in the drop down list of team players, click on the FIND button to do a search of their surname. If their name appears click on it and it will appear in grey under the appropriate box. If their name does not appear write a note for the Administrator in the box at the bottom of the screen giving player's full name and position played. Don't forget to search all clubs as some players may have a player code from another club if they play for more than one club.

When I go to enter the results it won't let me in?

Match Hub Rankings will not let you in once a result has been recorded. Even though you are the winning team sometimes your opposition may have already entered the result. You cannot go back into correct results once they have been submitted. If you need to have something corrected you must send an email request to admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz with the name of the competition, grade, team and opposition and the details requiring change.

What are Match Hub Rankings?

Match Hub Rankings is a Grading List of all competitive tennis players in New Zealand. All players, regardless of age, are in the same list however there are separate lists for males and females.

You can use Match Hub Rankings to search for the best players in your age group, club, association, region or nation.

Match Hub Rankings gradings are based on results in head to head matches. The number of points a player has denotes their Grade on a scale of one to twelve where one is best. Each Grade encompasses a range of about 300 points (see Gradings Table below).

A player who loses their Pro ranking will be dropped to S2.

A Player's position in the Grading table is based on results in Interclub and Tournament matches.

A Player moves up a grade when their points reach the next band level. After promotion a player receives 2 months immunity from being downgraded (except for grade 1). A player moves down a grade if their points drop below the bottom of their current band. However if the player has immunity then the player will instead be placed at the bottom of their current grade. Immunity lasts for 2 months after a grade promotion.

I'm new to Match Hub Rankings – how many points do I start on?

At the start of each interclub season there are a number of new players who must be given Match Hub Rankings codes and grades from which to start. All junior players (18 years old and under) regardless of age, will start on S12 unless otherwise evaluated by their club coach or club captain and be given the rank reflective of their ability.

How often are Gradings recalculated?

Match Hub Rankings gradings are recalculated on the 15th and last day of each month, or first workday thereafter. The recalculation takes all new match results and processes them in date order. The Match Hub Rankings website is updated immediately.

Am I in Match Hub Rankings already?

Go to www.tennis.kiwi and search for your name. You can also search the list by Grading, Association, Club, and Age group. Also view your own match history or that of your friends or opponents.

How do I get on Match Hub Rankings?

You need a Match Hub Rankings Player Code. This is a 6-7 character code that uniquely identifies you. It has the format NHNCR2F where NH = your Association (in this case North Harbour), NC = your Club (in this case Northcote), and R2F = your initials (in this case RF is Roger Federer). Having a number in your code (as above) means that more than one player at your club has the same initials as you. Therefore Roger is the 2nd RF at his club.

Tennis Northern will assign Match Hub Rankings player codes based on point recommendations from your club. Please contact your club secretary to create a code. Codes are transferred if you move club or region.

Do I have to start at the bottom Grade?

No – you will be assigned a starting Grade, based on a club recommendation that places you at a level relative to your ability. Thereafter, actual match results will gradually move you up, or down, to your correct position.

Is there a minimum age to be in Match Hub Rankings?

No – but results are generally only counted from events open to 10 year olds or older. So an 8 or 9 year old could be in Match Hub Rankings if they are playing in 10u events.

What results count towards my Grading?

All results count from tournaments on the Regional and National Calendar, including consolation events that are run using Tournament Planner. Results from matches between New Zealand players in overseas events are also captured (eq ATP, WTA and ITF).

Results from regional and club events can also be included when they have been flagged as counting towards Match Hub Rankings. National Teams events as well as many inter-provincial teams events are captured, also Interclub competitions run using the Match Hub Rankings Interclub system will count. The more matches you play then the more accurate your Grading will be.

ITF World Tennis Number (WTN)

Interclub matches that are entered into Match Hub (www.tennis.org.nz) will NOT be counted for your WTN ranking. Only events that are run using Tournament Planner will be counted for your WTN ranking. More information on the WTN can be found at https://tennis.kiwi/ compete/wtn/

Mixed Gender Matches

Mixed gender matches can count towards Match Hub Rankings. Mixed gender matches are common in rural areas of the country where playing numbers are low, or in starter tournament play.

Can I play Interclub or Tournaments without a Player Code?

You must have a Player Code otherwise your results cannot be included in Match Hub Rankings. It is important to always include your Player Code when entering a Tournament.

What about privacy?

The only personal details shown on the website are name, association and club. Players may also request that their playing history be blocked from public view. Contact your Association to request this option.

What if I play for two clubs?

You have to nominate a home Association and Club that will be used for your Match Hub Rankings code. You can use the same code even if you play interclub for another club. This is so that all your results contribute to your grading.

What about Doubles matches?

Match Hub Rankings also calculates Doubles Gradings - based only on results from Doubles and Mixed matches. You do not have to have both a Singles and Doubles grading. It just depends on what competitive tennis you play. Match Hub Rankings maintains Doubles gradings using the same formula as for Singles. In Doubles matches, the average of each partnership's points is used to determine whether Grade Wins are won or lost.

How to Score a Game of Tennis – Beginners Guide

In the game of tennis – A match is made up by sets, a set is made up by games and a game is made up by points.

Match

A match can consist of:

- The best of two sets, with a 3rd set supertiebreak to ten points if required at one set all (commonly used in junior tournaments when playing lots of matches over a short time).
- 2. The first to two sets (most common in senior tennis).
- 3. The first to three sets (this is used in major professional tournaments).
- 4. Junior matches will often be even shorter in length, as time, age and ability allow. These will often be played as the first to 7/8/9 games.
- 5. Junior matches may also be short sets to four games. This gets players used to 'resetting their frame of mind' for a new set, as they would have to in senior matches.
- 6. There is a new shortened format called Fast 4 launched internationally in 2015.

Set

A set is completed when one of the players wins six games by a margin of two or more games. Therefore, the score would be 6-1, or 6-2, or 6-3, or 6-4, but not 6-5. It could be 7-5 (because a player won by a margin of two games). Should the score go to 6 games all, a tiebreaker to 7 points would be played to determine the winner of the set.

Game

The most difficult part of scoring in tennis is the game. Points make up a game. The first person to win 4 points (by a margin of two or more) is the winner of the game.

A point is scored when a player hits a winner or past the opponent, makes an error, or forces the opponent to make an error. The points are scored in this manner:

> 0 = Love1st Point = 15 2nd Point = 303rd Point = 404th Point = Game

In scoring, the server's points are always called first. For example, if the server wins the first point the score would be 15-love. If the receiver wins the first point, the score would be Love-15.

When the score becomes 3 points all (tied 40-40) the score would be 'deuce'. The next point won after deuce would be one of the players 'advantage'. It might be stated 'your advantage' or more formally stated 'advantage Miss Williams'. Some players might say advantage server or advantage receiver. All of these methods are acceptable means of calling the score in an advantage situation.

The next point won after the player's 'advantage' would be either 'game' or 'deuce' again. Deuce, advantage server, deuce, advantage receiver can go on indefinitely until one player wins by a margin of two points.

Some matches (in particular doubles) will have a sudden death deuce rule, meaning that at deuce the next point decides the game. The receiver or receiving pair get to choose which side the server serves to. Sudden death deuce is often used when time is short, however event rules will dictate if this scoring variation is applicable.

The Tiebreaker

The tiebreaker is played if the players reach 6 games all (in a best of three sets match) or as indicated in the competition rules. The next player to serve (Player A) will serve the first point from the right side. The next two points will be served by player B beginning from the left side, then the right.

The fourth and fifth points will be served by Player A beginning with the left, then the right. The sixth and seventh point is served by Player B beginning with the left side again. This goes on indefinitely until either player wins 7 points, by a margin of 2 or more. It is possible for the score to be as high as 21-19, because a player must win by two points or more to win the tiebreaker. After each six points of the tiebreaker, the players should switch ends of the court.

The Super Tiebreaker to 10 points is often played instead of the 3rd set to decide the match winner when the time is limited.

CAR PARK


Please take extra caution when you drive in and out of carpark. Never exceed 10km/hour speed limit. Be aware of people, especially children around the parked cars.

Self Umpiring Tennis Rules - FAQs

- All calls on your side of the net are your responsibility (i.e. you cannot ask an opponent for a let because you do not agree with their call). If you have any doubt as to whether a ball is in or out, you must give your opponent the benefit of the doubt and play the ball as good. You should not play a let.
- Any 'out' call must be made instantaneously (i.e. made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play); otherwise the ball continues in play. The call should be made both verbally and by using a hand signal.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators, including parents, in making calls.
- If a player incorrectly calls a ball 'out', and then realises the ball was good, the player who called the ball 'out' loses the point.
- To avoid controversy over the score, the server should announce the set score (e.g., 5-4) before starting a game and the game score (e.g. 30-40) prior to serving each point. Game scores must also be recorded on each end change and at the end of each set.
- Always use score boards when available
- You cannot call 'foot fault'. A player could courteously inform their opponent if they appear to be foot faulting repeatedly at change of ends.
- If there is a score dispute, both players should restart play on a previous score they both agree on.
- If a ball hits a permanent fixture (i.e. net post, umpire chair, light post) after the ball has hit the correct court, then the player who hit the shot wins the point. If a ball hits a permanent fixture before the ball has hit the correct court, then the player who hit the shot loses the point.
- If a player hits a shot that lands in the opponent's court, but then spins back into their own court or into the net, the player who hits the shot wins the point.
- A player's racquet may pass over the net after hitting the ball on their own side of the net.
- A player instantly loses the point if any part of their racquet, body or clothing touches the net.
- If a ball or external object (i.e. drink bottle, score sheet, bird) interrupts play at whatever stage in a point, each player has the right to call a let. The point will then begin with the server having a first serve.
- Underarm serving is legal and the server does not need to inform their opponent they are going to serve underarm.
- If play is disrupted for any reason (e.g. rain), the match will resume from the exact score as to when the disruption occurred.
- If a server throws up a ball toss, swings, and fails to contact the ball, the serve is deemed as a fault.

Interclub Team - Contact Details

Please read all interclub rules before you play your first match of the season. Answers to frequently asked interclub questions are available in this interclub handbook and TNR website.

One of the most common reasons that senior teams are docked points is from playing their team in the wrong order (seniors - rule 12). To make sure you don't play 'out of order', please copy your team list from the TNR website into the contact table below. Juniors may play in any order, but where possible should play in order of ability to ensure all matches are as even as possible. This contact sheet is for your reference only.

1 MEANINGS

In these rules:

- a) **Contest** means the total matches between one team and another.
- b) **Match** means one individual singles, doubles or mixed doubles.
- c) **TNR** shall mean Tennis Northern Region Incorporated.
- d) **Interclub Committee** means those persons ratified by the TNR board.
- e) Words importing one gender shall include the other gender and words importing the singular or plural numbers shall include the plural or singular numbers as the case may be or as the context shall require.
- f) **Interclub coordinator** shall be a person or persons appointed by the TNR management.
- q) Interclub Panel is a panel appointed by the Interclub Committee to make quick decisions on interclub matters that do not require the formal meeting of the full Interclub Committee.

2 INTERCLUB COMMITTEE

The Interclub Committee manages Interclub, under delegated authority from the TNR board, with the following powers:

- a) To arrange and control all Interclub competitions and rules.
- b) To interpret these rules.
- c) To decide any matters arising not covered by these rules.
- d) To disqualify, in its discretion, any club or player for any breach of these rules or to impose any penalty.
- e) To order, in its discretion, any contest or match to be replayed.
- f) To re-grade or decline any entry.

3 ALTERATIONS

- a) These rules supersede all previous Interclub Rules. All previous rules are to be disregarded whether or not they are directly covered in these rules.
- b) The Interclub Committee shall undertake a review of the Interclub Rules each season. The review shall include consultation with clubs.

4 COMPETITIONS

a) CHELSEA CUP (CC)

This competition has its own set of rules. CC players may play in Grade 1 Singles and Grade 1 Doubles in certain circumstances as detailed in Rule 9c).

b) SINGLES GRADES

Men's and Women's singles grades. These grades are made up of 4 players that play on an evening from Monday to Wednesday. Evening matches are played at both club courts and Forrest Hill and Albany Tennis Park centres on outdoor courts. A singles box league may also be held.

c) DOUBLES GRADES - MIXED

Each team consists of 4 men and 4 women. Teams play on a Saturday afternoon on club courts.

d) DOUBLES GRADES - MEN'S/WOMEN'S

Each team consists of 4 players, either 4 men or 4 women. Teams play on Wednesday and Thursday evenings.

e) WINTER INTERCLUB

Each Team consists of 4 players playing doubles. There are midweek mens and womens grades and weekend mixed grades

5 ENTRIES

- a) Ranking points will be calculated for each team from the Match Hub points of the top 4 players in singles grades and the top 4 men and top 4 women in the doubles grades. For mixed winter interclub the top 2 mens and top 2 womens points are used. Points will be as at 15 August prior to the start of the season for summer interclub and 15 May for winter interclub.
- b) The composition of grades will be decided by the calculated average Match Hub ranking
- c) In determining the final composition of the grades, promotion based on the previous season's results will be taken into account, except for winter interclub.
- d) Clubs may apply to the Interclub Committee to have a player's Match Hub points reviewed. Applications must include sufficient evidence to justify an amendment. Only amendments greater than 300 points (a band) will be considered.
- e) Applications can be made by a combination of 2 clubs to field a combined team. Eliqible reserves can be drawn from both clubs.

6 MAKE UP OF GRADES

All grades shall be composed of a maximum number of teams as determined by the Interclub Committee with generally not more than three teams from any one Club, per grade.

7 TEAM LISTS

- a) Clubs shall each season submit separate Singles and Doubles team lists to the TNR office by the dates notified.
- b) The list must include all regular men and women players for each team entered. If a player is going to play singles and doubles regularly they must be on both singles and doubles team lists. Players may appear in a different order on the two lists.
- c) Players **must be ranked in order of merit** for the teams they play for. Clubs are requested to use Match Hub to do this.
- d) On the Singles Team List each team must contain at least 4 designated singles players. On the Doubles Grading List each team must contain at least 4 men and/or 4 women as designated doubles players or for winter mixed at least 2 men and 2 women. Clubs may designate more players for singles and doubles teams if they wish however only the top four player's Match Hub points on each list will be used for team Match Hub points. One of the players must be named as captain and that person's telephone number and email address included on the team list.
- e) If a Club has more than one team in the same grade, players must be allocated to a specific team.

20 Tamariki Avenue, Orewa 09 427 9231 | www.gjgardner.co.nz f) Listed players may play out of their team SIX times in a season for singles, SIX times for midweek doubles and SIX times for weekend doubles provided they have a Match Hub ranking for the relevant competition. Players who play a seventh and subsequent time without prior permission from the Interclub Committee will default that match and all subsequent matches played as a reserve. If the player becomes listed in a new team then they may no longer reserve for any other team including the team they were originally listed in. Players can reserve for another club, in grades other than the grade of their listed team, in any competition (singles, doubles, mixed doubles) provided they have a ranking that complies with the reserve band for that grade.

Explanatory note:

- 1. This rule means a player can reserve up or down grades so long as their Match Hub ranking at the time qualifies them to do so under the Reserve Band set for that grade.
- 2. Where a club has more than one team in the same grade, players may reserve for their other club teams, as long as they meet the reserve band requirement for that grade. They may not reserve for another team in the same grade if their own listed team is using reserves i.e. they must play for their own team first.
- q) Any club members may reserve for any of their club team or any other club provided they have a Match Hub ranking for the relevant competition (i.e. doubles or singles). A Match Hub reserve band will be set for each grade at the start of the season and reserves cannot play for teams, at any time throughout the season, where their Match Hub grading/ranking is greater than the band set e.g. a D5 player may not reserve for a team with a D6 designation or lower. The Match Hub grading/ranking that applies is that recorded at the time the reserve plays. Ensure the Match Hub ranking of the reserve is checked the day before the match. A reserve can only play a maximum of 6 times in singles, 6 times in midweek doubles and 6 times in weekend doubles. Reserves that play a seventh and subsequent time without prior permission from the Interclub Committee will be defaulted. It is suggested that clubs ensure all likely reserves have a Match Hub ranking.
- h) For singles competition it is the singles Match Hub ranking that applies to the reserve band requirement. For doubles only competition, it is the doubles Match Hub ranking that applies to the reserve band requirement.

NOTES:

- 1. It is the responsibility of clubs, not TNR, to monitor the number of times reserves play and that their Match Hub ranking is within the reserve band required for the grade they are reserving for.
- 2. It is the Match Hub grading/ranking at the time the reserve is playing that should be used in determining eligibility.
- A club member may be added to a team list during the season by notifying TNR, however they cannot be added to a team which has a band set below the member's Match Hub band at the date of application/date of match. For example a D5 ranked player may not be added to a team with a D6 designation or lower as per g) above.

8 REGRADE APPLICATIONS

- a) A Club may make applications, through their Club Captain or approved Interclub person, to the Interclub Panel before 31 October to alter the playing order of a player on the team list. Such applications should be sent to the TNR office at least 5 working days before the player is due to play and will only be considered in exceptional circumstances with the club providing substantiated reasons for the application. Clubs should not consider their application to be successful until they have had confirmation from the TNR office.
- b) Between 24 December and 15 January Club Captains may alter the ranking of their players by submitting to the TNR office a new Team List to apply for the remainder of the interclub season.

NOTE: This re-ranking applies to the team list only. It does not allow players to change teams.

9 PLAYERS PLAYING IN SINGLES AND DOUBLES

- a) Singles, Weekend Doubles, Weekday Doubles and Winter Interclub are considered separate competitions and players may be nominated to play permanently in a singles and a weekend doubles and a weekday doubles team, and a winter interclub team. There are no cross grade restrictions.
- b) Players may play singles and doubles for different clubs. Players may reserve for other teams in grades other than the grade of their listed team in any competition as long as they comply with the reserve rules (18).
 - Special note: This rule is designed to increase the opportunities for enthusiastic players to play more tennis. The Interclub Committee will not allow clubs to use this rule to gain an unfair advantage in lower grades.
- c) Chelsea Cup (CC) players will be entitled to play CC and in the club's Grade 1 Singles and Grade 1 Doubles as long as their Match Hub singles ranking is \$2 or lower. Nominations for all CC players playing in these grades must be made by 31 October and no further nominations will be accepted.

10 ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

- a) Interclub teams can only be entered in the Tennis Northern interclub competitions by clubs affiliated to Tennis Northern.
- b) Players listed or reserving in teams must be a member of a tennis club affiliated to Tennis New Zealand. They do not have to be a member of the club they are playing for.
- c) Players can play or reserve for any club in each competition in grades other than the grade of their listed team. They may be different clubs in each competition or they may play for the same club.
- d) All players must be at least 15 years of age on or before the 31 December 2023, in order to play senior interclub. Dispensation for younger players will not be considered. Players must continue to play junior interclub until they turn 16 years of age
- e) If a club informs TNR that a player is unfinancial from the previous season that player will not be eligible to play interclub until the matter has been resolved to the satisfaction of the Interclub Committee.

11 CONTESTS

- a) Night singles are scheduled to commence at 6pm, midweek doubles at 6.30pm and weekend contests at 1.00pm. Note that some weekend contests may be delayed until 1.30pm due to junior interclub requirements. In this event the weekend teams must allow the junior team use of the courts until 1.30pm. Team Captains should be aware of varying floodlight shut-off times which may vary between club and TNR venues and with changes to daylight saving. Start times may be varied at the agreement of both captains if additional courts and lighting times permit.
- b) Team Captains should be aware of varying floodlight shut-off times which may vary between club and TNR venues and with changes to daylight saving. For night matches at club courts, the home club should make both clubs aware of the time their floodlights switch off and both teams should agree prior to starting a match that, if necessary, either play a shorter match or reschedule to complete the rest of the match on another day agreed by both teams. If an agreement cannot be reached, then whoever was leading at the time of the lights going out, will be deemed the winner of that contest. If no one was leading when the lights go out, then it's a countback on games. If there is still no agreement or it's a true tie or can't agree to reschedule then results will show as is and points are split, or the match is abandoned and no points awarded for the unfinished match.
- c) The captain of each team must supply the opposing team captain with a list of players (including first name and last name) in playing order before the start time. The team sheet must be fully filled out prior to the match commencing and may not be amended, once play has commenced.
- d) Unless agreed between the captains beforehand the first matches to play at starting times

Singles on 3 courts - 1&2 play singles, 3&4 play doubles. Singles on 2 courts - No.1 plays singles, 3 & 4 play doubles.

Doubles on 3 courts - the top men & women combinations and either the bottom men or the women combinations.

Doubles on 4 courts – 2 Mens doubles and 2 Womens

- e) Any team which does not have sufficient players (50% of the team) 30 minutes after the start time will be liable to default and fined.
- f) Clubs shall have available on the day set down for the contest a minimum of 2 courts per singles contest and 3 for doubles, in good order and condition.
- q) Summer Weekend Doubles contests shall consist of 2 men's doubles, 2 women's doubles and 4 mixed doubles. Matches shall be decided by the best of two 7 point tiebreaker sets with a ten point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required. A 3rd set tiebreaker should be shown on Match Hub as a 1-0 result.
- h) Weekend doubles teams may elect to play a full normal 7 point tiebreaker 3rd set instead of a 10 point super tiebreaker. This can only be done with the agreement of both pairs and must be decided before the commencement of the super tiebreaker. If any player in the 2 pairs does not agree then the 3rd set will continue as per rule 11g).
- i) Midweek singles matches will consist of four singles and two doubles. Singles matches shall be decided by the best of three 7 point tiebreaker sets with the tiebreaker at 6 all unless both players agree to play a 10 point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required. Doubles matches

- shall be decided by the best of two 7 point tiebreaker sets, with a 10 point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required. **UNLESS** clubs who only provide 2 courts for singles competition must play the best of two 7 point tiebreaker sets with a 10 point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required, for both singles and doubles matches.
- j) Midweek Men's and Women's Doubles matches will consist of four doubles matches. Matches shall be the best of two 7 point tiebreaker sets, with a ten point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required.
- k) Winter Weekend Doubles contests shall consist of 1 men's doubles, 1 women's doubles and 2 mixed doubles. Matches shall be decided by the best of two 7 point tiebreaker sets with a ten point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required. A 3rd set tiebreaker should be shown on Match Hub as a 1-0 result.

12 PLAYING ORDER

- a) In singles grade contests the highest team listed player on the night must play number 1 singles. Other players may play singles in any order. In the event that no permanent team listed players are available teams may play in any order. A reserve player CANNOT play number 1. For the doubles the players must play based on the singles order listed on the night 182 v 182, 384 v 384.
- b) In mixed doubles grade contests the highest team listed man and woman on the day must play in the number one men's and women's doubles matches. A reserve player CANNOT play number 1. The players from the top 2 men's and women's doubles combinations on the day must make up the top 2 mixed doubles combinations. (i.e. can either be 1&1, 1&2, 2&1 or 2&2).
- c) In Winter mixed doubles players may play in any order.
- d) In midweek doubles grade contests, including winter interclub, the highest listed man or woman on the day must play in the number one doubles position. A reserve player CANNOT play number 1. The matches shall be played on the basis of 1&2 v 1&2, 3&4 v 3&4, 1&3 v 1&3 and 2&4 v 2&4.
- e) In singles grade contests teams may substitute one player for the doubles. The substitute player must be included on the starting team list prior to the commencement of play as per Rule 11c). If the substitute is the highest listed in the team for that contest, they must play in the top doubles and one of the top 2 players left out. If the substitute is not the highest listed player they may substitute directly for any player but all other players remain in the doubles pair originally set by the singles playing order.
- f) In doubles grade contests teams may substitute one man and one woman for the mixed doubles. They must be included on the starting team list prior to the commencement of play as per Rule 11c). If the substitute is the highest listed player in the team for that contest, they must substitute into one of the top 2 pairs and one player from the top 2 pairs must drop out. In midweek doubles grade contests teams may substitute one player for one of the reverse doubles match. The substitute player must be included on the team playing list prior to the commencement of play as per Rule 11c).
- g) If a team is short of players and defaults one or more matches before play starts then it is the no.4 player or pair that is defaulted. I.e. players must move up in position so the no.4 position is defaulted not no.s 1 to 3.

h) In matches where the incorrect playing order is used, the match or matches affected will be defaulted and the points awarded to the opposition. The results are still recorded for ranking purposes.

Special Note: It is the order as per the entered team lists and not Match Hub Rankings for both Singles and Doubles.

13 POINTS

Points shall be awarded in each contest as follows:

- a) Each team shall receive one point for each match it wins. The team winning the greater number of matches shall receive 2 bonus points.
- b) Should the teams win an equal number of matches the winning team is the team which won more sets or if sets are equal won more games and will be awarded 2 bonus points. The losing team will be awarded 1 bonus point. If matches, sets and games are equal both teams will be awarded 1 bonus point.

Notes: In these calculations any match won by default will be:

- If Player A does not take the court, Player B wins the match 6-0, 6-0. When a match in progress is defaulted by Player A, Player B receives all remaining sets and games. A match that has already started cannot be recorded as a default.
- 2. A 3rd set super tiebreaker is counted as a set when a set count back is required. If sets are even and a count back of games is required then the super tiebreaker is counted as a game. This means the super tiebreaker could potentially have 2 values.

14 RESULTS

- a) Team captains will have a handbook in which they should record the contest results and have them signed off by the opposing captain. The books will be used by the Interclub Committee if it needs to resolve any disputes.
- b) The winning captain, or team member (see 14d) of any contest must enter the results in Match Hub on the TNR website within 48 hours of the contest being completed. Match results older than 4 weeks may be excluded from counting for grading points in the Match Hub Rankings System.
- c) The losing captain should check the Match Hub entries. If there is a disagreement the losing captain should first contact the winning captain to resolve the matter. If Match Hub needs to be adjusted the winning captain should email the TNR office ASAP to arrange it.
- d) Any team member can record a result providing that they are listed as a result recorder for that team and their email address is correct on the Match Hub system. To record a result players must enter their Match Hub player code into the 'Capture Results' section of the TNR website and request a password. The password will be automatically emailed to the listed email address for the player to record team results.
- e) Match results older than 4 weeks cannot be entered in the Match Hub system.

15 GRADE WINNERS

- a) The grade winner, except for grades designated by the Interclub Committee (see b) below), shall be the team which has accumulated the most points during the season. If two or more teams are equal on points at the end of the season a count back will be made to determine the winner, firstly of contests won and if these are equal of matches won and if these are equal of sets won and if these are equal of games won over the entire season. If points, contests, matches, sets and games are equal a playoff shall take place between 3 permanent mixed doubles pairs for doubles and 3 permanent players for singles in each team. The playoff shall be a super tiebreaker. The team winning 2 super tiebreakers shall be the winner. The same count back and playoff system shall be used to determine any other positions for promotion and relegation.
- b) TNR try their best to avoid the use of play-off rounds where possible. Where team numbers dictate the necessity to have grades with play-offs, we will use accumulative point's systems rather than semi and finals format. The format will be advised at the top of the draw at the start of each season. If necessary, the same count back and play off system in a) shall be used to determine a winner.

16 PROMOTION AND RELEGATION

- a) Grade 1 singles to Chelsea Cup. The first eligible team in the top 3 of grade one singles will automatically be promoted to the Chelsea Cup for the next season and the last placed Chelsea Cup team automatically relegated. An eligible team is one whose club does not already have a team in the Chelsea Cup. If there isn't an eligible team in the top 3 in grade one then the next eliqible team in that grade will play a promotion and relegation match against the bottom placed Chelsea Cup team.
- b) Other Grades: The highest placed team in each grade will be offered promotion to the next grade up in the following season regardless of Match Hub ranking points, provided that they are substantially the same team that won the grade. It is expected that the winning team will usually be promoted on the basis of their Match Hub ranking points but occasionally this may not happen. If a team is promoted this way they will replace the lowest ranked team in the next grade as per the Match Hub ranking points list.
- c) There is no promotion/relegation for winter interclub.

17 WEATHER

- a) Contests may only be postponed due to wet weather by agreement of both team captains. Contests may NOT be postponed until at least 1 hour after the scheduled start time i.e. 2pm for weekend doubles, 7pm for singles and 8pm for men's and women's doubles. Teams must always turn up for contests and play as many matches as possible as weather conditions in Auckland change very quickly. This particularly applies to matches on artificial grass.
- b) Any outstanding contests must be completed within 4 weeks of the original scheduled contest date. Unfinished matches in a contest shall be continued from the last point score when the match was halted. This applies whether play recommenced on the same day or on another day. Rescheduling of the contest is to be agreed between the two team captains. If play had already commenced, then the same players listed must complete that contest.
- c) If the outstanding contest is not played within 4 weeks of the original contest date then

the contest is abandoned and NO points will be awarded to either team. If the contest was partially completed then points for the completed matches will be awarded and NO points awarded for the unplayed matches. Bonus points will not be allocated for partially completed contests.

d) TNR will assist clubs to find courts if requested but the rescheduling of the contest is the sole responsibility of the team captains.

18 RESERVES

- a) If for any reason a player in a team is unable to play, a reserve (being a player qualified to play in that team according to the rules 7g) may be played. (Ensure the match hub ranking of the reserve player is checked the day before the match to confirm they are the correct rank)
- b) A reserve shall not play in the place of a player who has played or commenced to play in a match.
- c) Any club member may play a maximum of 6 times as a reserve for singles, 6 times for midweek doubles and 6 times for weekend doubles, provided they have a Match Hub ranking for the relevant competition. Players who play a seventh and subsequent time without prior permission from the Interclub Committee will be defaulted. Refer to rules 7f & 7g.
- d) Juniors under 15 as at 31 December 2023 may not reserve in Senior Interclub. No dispensation requests will be considered.
- e) A reserve may play in any order except #1 (as per rule 12a,b,d)

NOTE: It is the responsibility of clubs, not TNR, to monitor the number of times reserves play.

19 BALLS

a) All teams shall provide two pairs of new top grade canned balls of the brand adopted by TNR when playing on 3 courts or more and one pair when playing on 2 courts.

20 REPRESENTATIVE FIXTURES

- a) In the event of a contest clashing with a TNR/TNZ Representative Match or a TNR/TNZ controlled fixture, any team having two or more players in the Representative Team shall, if they so desire, have the Interclub Contest postponed. Notice to this effect must be given to the Interclub Committee one week prior to the date set down for the contest.
- b) Where a player has been selected in a TNR/TNZ Senior or Junior Representative Team or a TNR/TNZ controlled fixture and has declined selection for any reason, then that player cannot take part in Interclub matches on the date set down for such Representative match, and a substitute must be played by the Club concerned.

21 DEFAULTS

a) Each time a team loses a contest wholly by default it will have to pay the standard default fee of \$50. If a team defaults a third time it will lose all competition points for the season. The default fee will normally be invoiced to the club within 2 weeks of each default notified. A default is not recorded as long as a team fields at least 50% of its players.

- b) All claims for defaults must be lodged with the TNR office within three days of the contest on the official complaint form. (available to download from TNR website www.tennisnorthern. co.nz) The Interclub Panel will then contact the clubs concerned and after giving full consideration to the facts decide whether the default will be awarded or the contest be replayed.
- c) Teams that win a contest by default will receive points for that contest equal to the average of the points they have accumulated in the other contests they played over the season. These points will be awarded upon completion of their final match of the season.

22 CLOTHING

In all matches players must wear clothing and shoes specifically designed for tennis.

23 PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

- a) Players must conduct themselves in a manner appropriate to the game of tennis during all matches. The Tennis New Zealand Player Code of Conduct and Tennis New Zealand Self Umpiring Code shall apply to all interclub contests. These codes form part of these rules.
- b) Players guilty of verbal or physical misconduct shall be liable to default.
- c) Reports of misconduct must be made by Clubs through their club captain or approved interclub person in writing or by email to the TNR office within 7 days of the alleged offence. The Interclub Committee shall have the power to default a player if it thinks fit.

SELF UMPIRING CODE

Rules for interclub contests played without umpires:

- All calls on your side of the net are your responsibility. That is you cannot ask an opponent for a let because you do not agree with their call. If you have any doubt as to whether a ball is out or good you must give your opponent the benefit of the doubt and play the ball as good. You should not play a let.
- Any "out" call must be made instantaneously, that is made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play, otherwise the ball continues in play. The call should be made both verbally and by using a hand signal.
- Important: Do not enlist the aid of spectators in making calls
- If a player incorrectly calls a ball out, then realises the ball was good, the player who called the ball "out" loses the point.
- To avoid controversy over the score, the server should announce the set score (e.g. 5-4) before starting a game and the game score (e.g. 30-40) prior to serving each point. If players cannot agree on the score they must come to a mutual agreement over the last point and score they remember and replay all points thereafter.
- Be courteous to your opponent, do not stall, sulk, complain or practice gamesmanship.
- If the players cannot settle a dispute the team captains should be consulted and the dispute resolved.
- It is the responsibility of team captains to ensure their players behave appropriately on court and that the game is played to the rules and in the spirit that is intended.

24 COMPLAINTS AND RIGHT OF APPEAL

- a) Complaints or reports on breaches of these rules are to be made by Clubs (Club Captain, President or approved Interclub club contact person), in writing or by email, to the TNR office, within 7 days of the alleged breach. There is an official complaint form available to download from TNR website www.tennisnorthern.kiwi. All complaints or reports must include club name, team name, grade and competition, opposing club name, date, players' full names and a clear description of the nature of the complaint. Where the complaint may affect the outcome of the contest, a copy of the result sheet for that contest must be attached.
- b) The Interclub Panel will consider the complaint in the first instance and make a ruling.
- c) Clubs have a right of appeal to the Judiciary arm of the Interclub Committee if they disagree with a ruling made by the Interclub Panel. The appeal fee of \$200 is payable at the time of lodging the appeal. The appeal fee of \$200 will be refunded if the appeal is upheld.
- d) Clubs have a right of appeal to the Interclub Committee decisions under Rule 16 of the TNR constitution. This rule is titled "Discipline, Disputes and Appeals" and outlines the procedures for such appeals.
- e) If the Interclub Committee rules that disciplinary action is necessary the following procedure will usually be followed:
- First complaint- the player concerned receives an official warning. This will be sent to the player's club captain by TNR.
- Second complaint- the player concerned will be stood down from the next interclub match after the ruling. Confirmation of the suspension will be sent to the player's club captain and team captain by TNR.
- Third complaint- the player concerned will be suspended for the season. Confirmation of this will be sent to the player's club captain and team captain by TNR.
- After each complaint it is expected that clubs will take their own disciplinary action to ensure that appropriate behaviour is displayed by club members.
