QUICK GUIDE TO INTERCLUB MATCHES

For detailed information regarding interclub rules, refer to pages 7-13 in this Handbook.

- 1) Prior to the start of each Fixture, **both teams must input their team lists into MatchPoint prior to the start of the fixture**, with the team on the left being responsible for inputting the scores and the team on the right being responsible for confirming the results. All results **MUST** BE submitted via MatchPoint within 14 days of the contest being played. **RESULTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE. It is the responsibility of both teams to ensure results have been entered.** Contact the administrator if there are any issues.
- 2) Double check your draw prior to your Fixture to confirm the venue, as this may be changed at any time due to unforeseen circumstances.
- 3) All matches should start at the time indicated on the draw. Teams should try to arrive early to warm-up (off court, if the courts are in use) and be ready to start play at the allocated time. All matches must start within 20 minutes of their scheduled start time, which allows for a small hit-up time as well as any late arrivals.
- 4) The playing order stated in the rule 11 must be followed. Teams should do their best to accommodate each other and play within the spirit of the game.
- 5) All players must wear attire that allows ball storage whilst serving.
- 6) The latest finishing time will vary with each venue. Players should respect venue rules, particularly about light restrictions. Every endeavour must be made to complete all matches on the day scheduled.
- 7) Any matches not completed due to adverse weather must be completed as soon as possible at a time arranged by the team captains/managers. They may be played at the Albany Tennis Park, Forrest Hill or on club courts. To book Albany Tennis Park or Forrest Hill courts, email admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz.
- 8) Only those courts assigned on the draw should be used as vacant courts may already be booked. Please check vacant court availability before use.
- 9) It is recommended that valuable items be taken onto court by players rather than leaving them in cars.
- 10) Avoid defaulting Fixtures. In Senior Interclub there is a penalty fee of \$75.00 if a Fixture is defaulted.

FAQs ABOUT INTERCLUB, MatchPoint, WTN Ratings, DRAWS & HOW TO ENTER INTERCLUB RESULTS

How do I find out my interclub draw?

Your draw can be found after logging into the MatchPoint Scoring App or by going to <https://results.matchpoint.kiwi>
Select Northern and the appropriate competition, this is then broken down by grade and round.

To see your full schedule in one screen, click on “Entries” and find your team.

You must check the website regularly for changes to your draw i.e. the night before you play. Tell ALL your team members to do the same so they are aware of any changes.

How do I enter my team's interclub results?

Step 1: Create your login at <https://matchpoint.kiwi> -You must do this first

Step 2: Download the app from the Google Play or Apple App Store and search "MatchPoint Scoring"

Step 3: Enter your login details

Step 4: Go to the top left and open the menu and select find a fixture

Step 5: Select your teams & enter your results – Please review the User Guide for full instructions found at <https://support.matchpoint.kiwi>

Note: **Both teams must input their team lists into MatchPoint prior to the start of the fixture**, with the team on the left being responsible for inputting the scores and the team on the right being responsible for confirming the results. Results MUST be submitted via MatchPoint within 14 days of matches being played.

If you do not enter names for all players, then no players will receive any rating points.

Use the ladder button to review the points table.

When I requested a password reset I don't receive a code, why?

This will be because you don't have an email address attached to your MatchPoint account or it has gone to your spam/junk folder. If it is not in the spam or junk folder, check with your club administrator what your registered email address is or have them add it into the system.

Our opposition defaulted but we have not been awarded any points?

Senior and Junior Interclub default points are based on your team's average for the season and they can only be calculated once all matches Fixtures have been played. This will be at the end of the season. If a Senior team defaults a match Fixture the club will be fined and if a senior team defaults a third time they will lose their position in that grade for the rest of the season.

Do I have to enter the results after every fixture? And can someone else from my team enter them?

Both teams are responsible for pieces of scoring the fixture in some respect. Best practice is for scores to be entered during the fixture after each match is completed and then at the end of the fixture the team on the left of the app will finalise the results and then the team on the right of the app will confirm them. Results MUST be submitted via MatchPoint within 14 days of matches being played.

Why can't I find a player in our team or the other team?

The player is not on the team in MatchPoint. If you click on the drop-down list, select 'Substitute from MatchPoint', this will allow you to add a player (in accordance with competition rules) to the team as a substitute by searching their last name, and club if necessary. If a player does not appear they may not be in the system and can be listed as 'substitute'. You will need to contact your club and cc admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz to get them added. No players will receive any ratings points until all players names are showing in the match.

When we have a draw, why does the points table show no points added for the winner on sets/ games countback?

When it is a draw let Tennis Northern know via admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz and they will manually adjust based on the winner on countback.

What happens if the result has already been loaded?

You will not be able to adjust the score after it has been submitted and will need to email admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz to amend if they are wrong.

Why is the points table not showing my team's latest result?

This is because it has either not been finalised or confirmed by one/either team. Results don't show on the points table unless it has been confirmed by the team on the right of the app, or it's a draw and the administrator needs to amend the points.

What are ITF WTN Ratings?

WTN (World Tennis Number) is a rating system created by the ITF, it is used in over 70 countries around the world and produces a rating (similar to MatchHub) between 1 and 40 with 1 being Janik Sinner and 40 being a beginner 9 year old. I'm new to MatchPoint Ratings -how many points do I start on?

With WTN you no longer receive "points" the algorithm compares your number to your opponent(s) and you will move up or down depending on your result in that match

How often are Ratings recalculated?

Results are calculated weekly on a Wednesday night; these results are only counted if they have been finalised in time for the update.

Am I in ITF WTN already?

If you played interclub in the last 3 years you will be in MatchPoint and if your account had a date of birth, you will also have a WTN rating.

Is there a minimum age to have an ITF WTN rating?

You must be 9 years or older.

What results count towards my Rating?

All results from tournaments, interclub and box leagues can go to WTN provided your opponent has a WTN.

How do Mixed Gender matches get counted?

The formula applies the same, the WTN does not provide a different scale for Male and Female so it will take your rating into account with your opponents.

Can I play Interclub or Tournaments without an ITF WTN?

You must have a WTN otherwise your results cannot be included in the ITF WTN ratings system. It is important to always include your WTN when entering a Tournament.

What about privacy?

The only personal details shown on the website are name, association and club. Players may also request that their playing history be blocked from public view. Contact your Association to request this option.

What if I play for two clubs?

You are able to play for two clubs provided they are in line with competition rules, in MatchPoint you can have a primary club and as many secondary clubs as you like.

How are singles matches calculated for WTN?

The algorithm, calculates an expected result to set level (i.e. how many sets you win or lose in) based on your opponent's rating and if you match or do better/worse than it's expected result your rating will adjust accordingly.

How are doubles matches calculated for WTN?

The algorithm, calculates an expected result to set level (i.e. how many sets you win or lose in) based on your opponents' rating and if you match or do better/worse than it's expected result your rating will adjust accordingly.

How to Score a Game of Tennis – Beginners Guide

In the game of tennis – A match is made up of sets, a set is made up of games and a game is made up of points.

Match

An interclub match typically comprises either:

1. The best of two sets, with a 3rd set super tiebreak to ten points if required at one set all: or
2. The best to three sets.

Set

A set is completed when one of the players wins six games, by a margin of two or more games. The score could be 6-1, 6-2, 6-3, or 6-4, but not 6-5. It could be 7-5 (because a player won by a margin of two games). Should the score go to 6 games all, a 7-point tiebreak is played to determine the winner of the set.

Game

Points make up a game. The first person to win 4 points (by a margin of two or more) is the winner of the game.

A point is scored when a player hits a winner or past the opponent, makes an error, or forces the opponent to make an error. The points are scored in this manner:

0 = Love
1st Point = 15
2nd Point = 30
3rd Point = 40
4th Point = Game

In scoring, the server's points are always called first. For example, if the server wins the first point the score would be 15-love. If the receiver wins the first point, the score would be Love-15.

When the score becomes 3 points all (tied 40-40) the score would be 'deuce'. The next point won after deuce would be one of the players 'advantage'. It might be stated 'your advantage' or more formally stated 'advantage Miss Williams'. Some players might say advantage server or advantage receiver. All of these methods are acceptable means of calling the score in an advantage situation.

The next point won after the player's 'advantage' would be either 'game' or 'deuce' again. Deuce, advantage server, deuce, advantage receiver can go on indefinitely until one player wins by a margin of two points.

Tiebreaker

A tiebreak is played if the players reach 6 games all (in a best of three sets match) or as indicated in the competition rules. The next player to serve (Player A) will serve the first point from the right side. The next two points will be served by player B beginning from the left side, then the right.

The fourth and fifth points will be served by Player A beginning with the left, then the right. The sixth and seventh point is served by Player B beginning with the left side again. This goes on indefinitely until either player wins 7-points, by a margin of 2 or more. It is possible for the score to be as high as 21-19, because a player must win by two points or more to win the tiebreaker. After each six points of the tiebreaker, the players should switch ends of the court.

For some Fixtures, including all senior doubles matches, a 10-point Super Tiebreak is played instead of the 3rd set to decide the match winner.

Looking After your Tennis Centre at Forrest Hill

FIRST AID KITS AND DEFIBRILLATOR

First Aid kits and a defibrillator are located inside the clubhouse.

CHILDREN

The Albany Tennis Park facility has a **no rubbish policy** and bins will not be available. Please take away any rubbish you bring to the centre such as drink bottles, ball cans, food containers etc.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

Notices advising of what action to take in case of an accident/incident are on display by the entrance doors and in the pro shop.

There is no public telephone at Albany Tennis Park, therefore ensure that you have a means of contacting the emergency services should the need arise. Details of ATP's exact location are on display on the notice board.

It is your individual responsibility to inform your club team mates, team manager and/or opponents if you have any known medical condition that you have that may require immediate assistance.

FIRST AID KITS AND DEFIBRILLATOR

First Aid kits are located in the Pro Shop, TNR office and the Café.

A Defibrillator is located inside of the centre building on the ground floor corridor opposite the changing rooms.

CHILDREN

Children using the facilities do so subject to appropriate parental permission. Parents have a duty to inform those adults supervising children during Interclub of any relevant health information in relation to their child. Parents also have a responsibility to ensure that their child behaves in an appropriate way and does not do anything which may endanger themselves or other users.

SAFETY RULES AND COURT ETIQUETE

SUN/HEAT SAFE

CAR PARK

Please take extra caution when you drive in and out of carpark. Never exceed 10km/hour speed limit. Be aware of people, especially children around the parked cars.

Do not park on the corner of the driveway nor grassed area.

Health and Safety at club, school and other sport facilities

Health and Safety regulations require that all facilities put the H&S policies into place and that these are readily available to all users, which include Interclub teams.

The Health and Safety policy for each facility takes account of its own specific circumstances. Please refer to the club, school or the sport facility's information usually available on their website.

Self-Umpiring Tennis Rules - FAQs

- All calls on your side of the net are your responsibility (i.e. you cannot ask an opponent for a let because you do not agree with their call). If you have any doubt as to whether a ball is in or out, you must give your opponent the benefit of the doubt and play the ball as good. You should not play a let.
- Any "out" call must be made instantaneously (i.e. made before either an opponent has hit the return, or the return has gone out of play); otherwise, the ball continues in play. The call should be made both verbally and by using a hand signal.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators, including parents, in making calls.
- If a player incorrectly calls a ball "out", and then realises the ball was good, the player who called the ball "out" loses the point.
- To avoid controversy over the score, the server should announce the set score (e.g. 5-4) before starting a game and the game score (e.g. 30-40) prior to serving each point. Game scores must also be recorded on each end change and at the end of each set.
- Always use score boards when available.
- If there is a score dispute, both players should restart play on a previous score they both agree on.
- A player's racquet may pass over the net after hitting the ball on their own side of the net.
- A player instantly loses the point if any part of their racquet, body or clothing touches the net.

Refer to Rule 23 for a comprehensive list of self-umpiring rules.

1 MEANINGS

In these rules:

- Fixture means the total matches between one team and another.
- Match means one individual singles, doubles or mixed doubles match.
- TNR shall mean Tennis Northern Region Incorporated.
- Interclub Manager shall be a person or persons appointed by the TNR management.
- Interclub Committee means those persons ratified by the TNR board to administer interclub tennis for TNR.
- Interclub Panel is a panel appointed by the Interclub Committee to make quick decisions on interclub matters and/or complaints that do not require the formal meeting of the full Interclub Committee.
- Words importing one gender shall include the other gender and words importing the singular or plural numbers shall include the plural or singular numbers as the case may be or as the context shall require.
- Reserves and Substitutes are interchangeable and means a player who is not a permanently listed player in an interclub team.

2 INTERCLUB COMMITTEE

The Interclub Committee oversees interclub, under delegated authority from the TNR board, with help from the Interclub Manager. This Committee has the following powers:

- To arrange and control all Interclub competitions and rules.
- To interpret these rules.
- To decide any matters arising not covered by these rules.
- To disqualify, in its discretion, any club or player for any breach of these rules or to impose any penalty.
- To order, in its discretion, any Fixture or match to be replayed.
- To re-grade or decline any entry.

- g) To reserve the right to decline entries from a club for any competition listed in Rule 4, where the club does not provide any home courts for this competition. This power will only be exercised by the Committee after discussion with the club(s) affected, and after consultation with the TNR Interclub Manager and CEO.

3 ALTERATIONS

- a) In consultation with all TNR clubs, the Interclub Committee shall undertake an annual review of the Interclub Rules at the end of the season.
- b) These rules incorporate recommended changes arising from the annual review, which have then been accepted by TNR.
- c) These rules replace all previous Interclub Rules.

4 COMPETITIONS

- a) CHELSEA CUP (CC)

This competition has its own set of rules.

- b) SINGLES GRADES

Mens and Womens singles grades. These grades are made up of 4 players that play on an evening from Monday to Wednesday. Evening matches are played at either club courts, Forrest Hill Tennis Centre or Albany Tennis Park on outdoor courts. A singles box league may also be held.

- c) DOUBLES GRADES - MIXED

Saturday mixed doubles. Each team consists of 4 men and 4 women. Teams generally play on club courts.

- d) DOUBLES GRADES - MENS/WOMENS

Each team consists of 4 players, either 4 men or 4 women. Teams play on Thursday evenings at either club courts, Forrest Hill Tennis Centre or Albany Tennis Park on outdoor courts.

- e) WINTER INTERCLUB

Each Team consists of 4 players playing doubles. There are midweek mens and womens grades and weekend mixed grades. Teams generally play on club courts.

5 ENTRIES

- a) WTN rating points will be calculated for each team in MatchPoint based on the WTN points of the top 4 players in singles grades and the top 4 men and top 4 women in the doubles grades. For mixed winter interclub the top 2 mens and top 2 womens points are used. Points will be as at the dates set prior to the start of the season for summer and winter interclub.
- b) The composition of grades will be decided by the calculated average WTN ratings as showing in MatchPoint.
- c) In determining the final composition of the grades, promotion based on the previous season's results will be taken into account except for winter interclub.
- d) Applications can be made by a combination of 2 clubs to field a combined team. Eligible reserves can be drawn from both clubs.

6 MAKE UP OF GRADES

- a) All grades shall be composed of a maximum number of teams as determined by the Interclub Committee, with generally not more than 2 teams from any one Club, per grade.
- b) For the 2026/27 season, subject to the number of teams registered to play, grades will generally comprise 6 teams and these grades will have 10 rounds, played on a 'home and away' basis (subject to club court availability). This grade format will be reviewed by the Interclub Committee at the end of the 26/27 season.
- c) Where grades have more than 6 teams, these grades will have a single round robin followed by playoffs. Final details will be advised in the draw for the relevant grade(s).

7 TEAM LISTS

- a) Clubs shall submit separate Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles team lists via online entry into MatchPoint by the dates notified by TNR.
- b) The team lists should include all regular men and women players for each team entered. If a player is going to play singles and doubles regularly, they must be on both singles and doubles team lists.
- c) Players will show on the team list based on alphabetical order of surname, with their current WTN number showing.
- d) On the Singles Team List each team must contain at least 4 designated singles players. On the Doubles Team List, each team must contain at least 4 men and/or 4 women as designated doubles players and for Winter Mixed, at least 2 men and 2 women. Clubs may designate more players for singles and doubles teams if they wish however only the top 4 player's WTN rating on each list will be used for calculating the team point average. One of the players must be named as Primary Contact (captain) and that person's telephone number and email address included on the team list.

- e) Where a club has more than one team in the same grade, players may reserve for their other club teams, so long as they meet the reserve band requirement for that grade. They may not reserve for another team in the same grade if their own listed team is using reserves i.e. they must play for their own team first.
- f) For the 26/27 season, listed players may reserve indefinitely for any team in the club they are a member of, provided they have a WTN rating that complies with the reserve band for that grade. They cannot be listed in more than one team in the same competition.
- g) Listed players can also reserve for another club, in grades other than the grade of their listed team(s), in any competition (singles, doubles, mixed doubles) provided they have a WTN rating that complies with the reserve band for that grade.
- h) Rules 7f) and 7g) will be reviewed by the Interclub Committee at the end of the 26/27 season.

Explanatory notes:

1. Rules 7f) and 7g) means a player can reserve up or down grades so long as their WTN rating at the time qualifies them to do so under the Reserve Band set for that grade.
 2. The Interclub Committee will not allow clubs to use Rules 7f) and 7g) to gain an unfair advantage and may refer inappropriate use of this rule to the Interclub Panel for consideration.
- i) A WTN reserve band will be set for each grade at the start of the season and reserves cannot play for teams, at any time throughout the season, where their WTN rating is greater than the band set e.g. a WTN 25 player may not reserve for a team with a WTN 26 designation or lower. *The WTN rating that applies is **that recorded at the time the reserve plays**. Ensure the WTN rating of the reserve is checked the day before the match.* Listed players may reserve unlimited times for any team (except in their own grade) in the club they are a member of, provided they have a WTN rating that complies with the reserve band for that grade, in a grade other than their own. Clubs must ensure all likely reserves have a WTN rating.
 - j) For singles competitions it is the singles WTN rating that applies to the reserve band requirement at the time the reserve is playing. For doubles only competitions, it is the doubles WTN rating that applies to the reserve band requirement at the time the reserve is playing.
 - k) A club member may be added to a team list during the season by notifying TNR, however they cannot be added to a team which has a band set below the member's WTN rating at the date of application/date of match. For example a WTN 25 rated player may not be added to a team with a WTN 26 rated designation or lower as per g) above.

8 PLAYERS PLAYING IN SINGLES AND DOUBLES

- a) Singles, Weekend Doubles, Weekday Doubles and Winter Interclub are considered separate competitions and players may be nominated to play permanently in a singles and a weekend doubles and a weekday doubles team, and a winter interclub team. There are no cross-grade restrictions.
- b) Players may play singles and doubles for different clubs, but may not be listed in more than one team in the same competition.

9 ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

- a) Interclub teams can only be entered in TNR interclub competitions by clubs affiliated to TNR.
- b) Players listed or reserving in teams must be a member of a tennis club affiliated to Tennis New Zealand. They do not have to be a member of the club they are playing for.
- c) Players can play or reserve an unlimited number of times for any club in each competition in grades other than the grade of their listed team, provided they have a WTN rating that complies with the reserve band for that grade.
- d) All players must be at least **15** years of age as of 31st December 2026 to play senior interclub. Dispensation for players aged under 15 years of age ("Young Juniors") will be considered by the Interclub Committee where the player is expected to have the ability and maturity for the top 4 grades only. Applications for dispensation should be emailed to the Interclub Manager, explaining why dispensation is being requested. Dispensation criteria will include assessment of the Young Player's ability (grade), parental approval and appropriate measures regarding safeguarding and transport to/from the venue and home. Young Juniors must also continue to play junior interclub until they turn 16 years of age.
- e) If a club informs TNR that a player is unfinancial from the previous season, that player will not be eligible to play interclub for any club in a TNR competition until the matter has been resolved to the satisfaction of the Interclub Panel.

10 FIXTURES

- a) Midweek singles are scheduled to commence at 6pm, midweek doubles at 6.30pm and weekend Fixtures at 1.00pm. Note that some weekend Fixtures may be delayed until 1.30pm due to junior interclub requirements. In this event the weekend teams must allow the junior team use of the courts until 1.30pm.
- b) Team Captains should be aware of varying floodlight shut-off times which may vary between club and TNR venues and with changes to daylight saving. For night matches at club courts, the home club should make both clubs aware of the time their floodlights switch off and

both teams should agree prior to starting a match that, if necessary, either play a shorter match or reschedule to complete the rest of the match on another day agreed by both teams. If an agreement cannot be reached, then whoever was leading at the time of the lights going out, will be deemed the winner of that Fixture. If no one was leading when the lights go out, then it's a countback on games. If there is still no agreement or it's a true tie or can't agree to reschedule then results will show as is and points are split, or the match is abandoned and no points awarded for the unfinished match.

- c) Both teams must input their team lists into MatchPoint prior to the start of the fixture, with the team on the left being responsible for inputting the scores and the team on the right being responsible for confirming the results. The team lists must be fully filled out prior to the fixture commencing. If you do not enter names for all players, then no players will receive any rating points. **RESULTS MUST BE SUBMITTED VIA MATCHPOINT WITHIN 14 DAYS FROM THE MATCH DATE.**
- d) A player injured during a match who is unable to continue may be replaced for the following match, providing they meet the appropriate reserve band. They can only play in the position of the injured player. The player must be available 15 minutes from the start time of the next match.
- e) Teams can agree on a match playing order, however if an agreement cannot be reached beforehand, the following order should be used:
Singles on 3 courts - 1&2 play singles, 3&4 play doubles or 3&4 play singles and 1&2 play doubles.
Mixed Doubles (8 person teams) on 3 courts - the top men & women combinations and either the bottom men or the women combinations.
Mixed Doubles (8 person teams) on 4 courts – 2 Mens doubles and 2 Womens, followed by 4 Mixed Doubles.
Doubles (4 person teams) on 2 courts – 2 mens/womens doubles
- f) Any team which does not have sufficient players (50% of the team) 30 minutes after the start time will be liable to default and fined.
- g) Clubs shall have available on the day set down for the Fixture a minimum of 3 courts per singles Fixture, 3 for mixed doubles (8 person teams), and 2 for doubles (4 person teams) in good order and condition.
- h) **Midweek singles** fixtures will consist of 4 singles and 2 doubles matches. Singles matches shall be decided by the best of two 7-point tiebreak sets with a 10-point super tiebreak 3rd set if required, unless both players agree to play a full normal 3rd set 7-point tiebreak. Doubles matches shall be decided by the best of two 7-point tiebreak sets, with a 10-point super tiebreak 3rd set if required. When entering the super tiebreak score into MatchPoint, the game score for the 3rd set is recorded as 1-0 and the tiebreak score entered into the appropriate tiebreak boxes showing.
- i) **Midweek Mens and Womens Doubles** fixtures will consist of 4 doubles matches. Matches shall be the best of two 7-point tiebreak sets, with a 10-point super tiebreak 3rd set if required. When entering the super tiebreak score into MatchPoint, the game score for the 3rd set is recorded as 1-0 and the tiebreak score entered into the appropriate tiebreak boxes showing.
- j) **Summer Weekend Mixed Doubles** fixtures will consist of 2 mens doubles, 2 womens doubles and 4 mixed doubles matches. Matches shall be decided by the best of two 7-point tiebreak sets with a 10-point super tiebreak 3rd set if required. A super tiebreak should be shown on. When entering the super tiebreak score into MatchPoint, the game score for the 3rd set is recorded as 1-0 and the tiebreak score entered into the appropriate tiebreak boxes showing.
- k) Weekend doubles teams may elect to play a full normal 7-point tiebreak 3rd set instead of a 10-point super tiebreak. This can only be done with the agreement of both pairs and must be agreed before the commencement of the super tiebreak. If any player in the 2 pairs does not agree, then the 3rd set must be a 10-point super tiebreak.
- l) Winter Weekend Doubles fixtures shall consist of 1 men's doubles, 1 women's doubles and 2 mixed doubles. Matches shall be decided by the best of two 7-point tiebreaker sets with a 10-point 3rd set super tiebreaker if required. When entering the super tiebreak score into MatchPoint, the game score for the 3rd set is recorded as 1-0 and the tiebreak score entered into the appropriate tiebreak boxes showing.

11 PLAYING ORDER

- a) In Singles grade Fixtures, players can be listed in any order for the singles matches. For the doubles matches, the players must play based on the singles order listed on the night 1&2 v 1&2, 3&4 v 3&4. TNR expects the **best player** on the night should play at #1.
- b) In Mixed Doubles grade Fixtures, players can be listed in any order for the first matches. The players from the top 2 mens and womens doubles combinations on the day must make up the top 2 mixed doubles combinations. (i.e. can either be 1&1, 1&2, 2&1 or 2&2). TNR expects the **best player** on the night should play at #1.
- c) In Winter Mixed Doubles, players may play in any order.
- d) In Midweek Doubles grade Fixtures, including winter interclub, players can be listed in any order for the first matches. The matches shall be played on the basis of 1&2 v 1&2, 3&4 v 3&4, 1&3 v 1&3 and 2&4 v 2&4. TNR expects the **best player** on the night should play at #1.
- e) In Singles grade Fixtures, teams may substitute 1 player for the doubles match. The substitute player must be included on the starting team list prior to the commencement of play as per Rule 10c). If the substitute is the highest listed player in the team for that Fixture, they must play in the top doubles and one of the top 2 players left out. If the substitute is not the highest listed player, they may substitute directly for any player, but all other players remain in the doubles pair originally set by the singles playing order.
- f) In Midweek Doubles grade Fixtures, teams may substitute 1 player for one of the reverse doubles matches. The substitute player must be included on the team playing list prior to the commencement of play as per Rule 10c).

- g) In Mixed Doubles grade Fixtures, teams may substitute 1 man and 1 woman for the mixed doubles matches. They must be included on the starting team list prior to the commencement of play as per Rule 10c).
- h) If a team is short of players and defaults one or more matches before play starts, then it is the number 4 player or pair that is defaulted. I.e. players must move up in playing order so the number 4 position is defaulted; not playing order numbers 1 to 3.
- i) In Fixtures where the incorrect playing order is used, the match or matches affected will be defaulted and the points awarded to the opposition. The results are still recorded for ranking purposes.
- j) Team playing orders will be reviewed at the end of the 26/27 season.

12 POINTS

Points shall be awarded in each fixture Fixture as follows:

- a) Each team shall receive 1 point for each match it wins. The team winning the greater number of matches shall receive 2 bonus points.
- b) Should the teams win an equal number of matches the winning team is the team which won more sets or if sets are equal won more games and will be awarded 2 bonus points. The losing team will be awarded 1 bonus point. If matches, sets and games are equal both teams will be awarded 1 bonus point each.

Notes: In these calculations any match won by default will be:

- 1. If Player A does not take the court, Player B wins the match 6-0, 6-0. When a match in progress is defaulted by Player A, Player B receives all remaining sets and games. A match that has already started cannot be recorded as a default.
- 2. A super tiebreak 3rd set is counted as a set when a set count back is required. If sets are even and a count back of games is required then the super tiebreak is counted as 1 game.

13 RESULTS

- a) Both teams are responsible for scoring the fixture in the App. Best practice is for scores to be entered during the fixture after each match is completed and then at the end of the fixture the team on the left of the App will finalise the results and then the team on the right of the App will confirm them.
- b) The team showing on the left side of the draw (home) is responsible for entering the scores and the team showing on the right side of the draw (away) is responsible for confirming the scores are correct.
- c) If the scores have been entered incorrectly, you will need to email admin@tennisnorthern.co.nz to get these corrected.
- d) Any team member that has been selected to manage the team entries (done at the time of team entries) can manage the team lists and scores.
- e) When entering scores, sets that were won with a tiebreak are entered as 7-6 in the game boxes, with the tiebreak scores being entered into the tiebreak boxes. For third set super tiebreaker, the score is recorded as 1-0 in the game boxes, with the super tiebreaker scores being entered into the tiebreak boxes.
- f) All results MUST BE submitted via MatchPoint within 14 days of being played. **RESULTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE. It is the responsibility of both teams to ensure results have been entered.** Contact the administrator if there are any issues.

14 GRADE WINNERS

- a) Except for grades designated by the Interclub Committee (see b) below), the grade winner shall be the team which has accumulated the most points during the season. If 2 or more teams are equal on points at the end of the season, a count back will be made to determine the winner, firstly of fixtures won; if these are equal, then of matches won; if these are equal, then of sets won; if these are equal then of games won over the entire season. If points, fixtures, matches, sets and games are equal a playoff shall take place between 3 permanent mixed doubles pairs for doubles and 3 permanent players for singles in each team. The playoff shall be a 10-point super tiebreak. The team winning 2 super tiebreaks shall be the winner. The same count back and playoff system shall be used to determine any other positions for promotion and relegation.
- b) TNR try their best to avoid the use of play-off rounds where possible. Where team numbers dictate the necessity to have grades with play-offs, players who play in the play-off rounds must have played a minimum of 3 matches in the season to be eligible. This is to prevent teams from bringing in stronger players for an advantage.
- c) Where any grade has play-off rounds, all teams will be placed into play-off rounds, but only the 4 top teams on the ladder will be in contention to win the pennant.

15 PROMOTION AND RELEGATION

There is no promotion/relegation for TNR interclub.

16 WEATHER

- a) Fixtures may only be postponed due to wet or adverse weather by agreement of both team captains. Fixtures should not be postponed until at least 1 hour after the scheduled start time i.e. 7.00pm for singles, 7.30pm for mens and womens doubles and 2.00pm for weekend doubles. Teams must always turn up for Fixtures and play as many matches as possible as weather conditions change quickly.
- b) Teams that can field at least 50% of their team (including any eligible reserves) are not liable for default and the players available to play should make every effort to do so.
- c) If one team is unable to play on the scheduled date, or does not turn up to play, that team will be defaulted and fined \$75.00 (see rule 20). It is the responsibility of the winning team to notify the Interclub Manager of the default.
- d) Any Fixtures postponed due to weather in accordance with rule 16 a) and must be emailed to the administrator for the draws to be updated. These must be completed by the date shown in the relevant draw. This will generally be 2 weeks after the last scheduled round, unless play-off rounds are required.
- e) If a Fixture is unable to commence play due to wet or adverse weather, a new team list can be used for the re-scheduled Fixture.
- f) Unfinished matches in a Fixture affected by wet or adverse weather shall be continued from the last point score when the match was halted. This applies whether play recommenced on the same day or on another day. Rescheduling of the affected matches is to be agreed between the two team captains. If play has already commenced, **the same players already listed** must complete that Fixture.
- g) TNR will assist clubs to find courts if requested but the rescheduling of the Fixture is the sole responsibility of the team captains.
- h) No points will be awarded to either team for fixtures not played.

17 RESERVES

- a) If for any reason a player in a team is unable to play, a reserve (being a player qualified to play in that team according to the rules 7f) may be played. (Ensure the WTN rating of the reserve player is checked the day before the match to confirm they comply with the reserve band set for that grade. Go to <https://results.matchpoint.kiwi> and select the rankings tab)
- b) A player injured during a match who is unable to continue may be replaced for the following match, providing they meet the appropriate reserve band. They can only play in the position of the injured player. The player must be available 15 minutes from the start time of the next match. (see rule 10c).
- c) Players may reserve an unlimited number of times for any team in the club they are a member of, in any grade, provided they have a ranking that complies with the reserve band for that grade. Players can also reserve an unlimited number of times per season for another club in a grade **other** than their own.
- d) Young Juniors may reserve in Senior Interclub, subject to rule 9d), whereby dispensation has already been granted.
- e) A reserve may play in any order, subject to rule 11 requirements.

18 BALLS

- a) All teams shall provide 2 pairs of new top grade canned balls of the brand adopted by TNR when playing on 3 courts or more and 1 pair when playing on 2 courts.

19 REPRESENTATIVE FIXTURES

- a) In the event of a Fixture clashing with a TNR/TNZ Representative Match or a TNR/TNZ controlled fixture, any team having 2 or more players in the Representative Team shall, if they so desire, have the Interclub Fixture postponed. Notice to this effect must be given to Interclub Manager 1 week prior to the date set down for the Fixture.
- b) Where a player has been selected in a TNR/TNZ Senior or Junior Representative Team or a TNR/TNZ controlled fixture and has declined selection for any reason, then that player cannot take part in Interclub matches on the date set down for such Representative match, and a substitute must be played by the Club concerned.

20 DEFAULTS

- a) Each time a team loses a Fixture wholly by default it will have to pay the standard default fee of \$75.00. If a team defaults a third time it will lose all competition points for the season. The default fee will normally be invoiced to the club within 2 weeks of each default notified. A default is not recorded as long as a team fields at least 50% of its players.
- b) Teams that win a Fixture by default will receive points for that Fixture equal to the average of the points they have accumulated in the other Fixtures they played over the season. These points will be awarded upon completion of their final match of the season.

21 PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

- a) Players must conduct themselves in a manner appropriate to the game of tennis during all matches. The Tennis New Zealand Player Code of Behaviour shall apply to all interclub Fixtures. These codes form part of these rules and can be accessed at <https://tennis.kiwi/assets/Files-pdf-word-docs-etc/2024-Code-of-Behaviour.pdf>.
- b) Be courteous to your opponent, do not stall, sulk, complain or practice gamesmanship.
- c) If the players cannot settle a dispute the team captains should be consulted and the dispute resolved.
- d) Team captains must ensure their team behaves appropriately on and off the court and that the game is played to the rules and in the spirit that is intended.
- e) Players guilty of verbal or physical misconduct shall be liable to default.
- f) Reports of misconduct must be made by Clubs through their club captain or approved interclub person by email to the Interclub Manager within 14 days of the alleged offence. The Interclub Panel shall have the power to default a player if it thinks fit.

22 SELF UMPIRING CODE

Rules for interclub Fixtures played without umpires:

- All calls on your side of the net are your responsibility (i.e. you cannot ask an opponent for a let because you disagree with their call). If you have any doubt as to whether a ball is in or out, you must give your opponent the benefit of the doubt and play the ball as "in". You should not replay the point (i.e. call "let").
- Any "out" call must be made instantaneously; that is made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play, otherwise the ball continues in play. The call should be made both verbally and by using a hand signal.
- If a player calls a ball "out" incorrectly, then realises the ball was "in", the player who called the ball "out" loses the point.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators in making calls.
- To avoid controversy over the score, the server should announce the set score (e.g. 5-4) before starting a game and the game score (e.g. 30-40) prior to serving each point. If players cannot agree on the score they must come to a mutual agreement over the last point and score they remember and replay all points thereafter.
- If a ball hits a permanent fixture (i.e. net post, umpire chair, light post) after the ball has hit the correct court, then the player who hit the shot wins the point. If a ball hits a permanent fixture before the ball has hit the correct court, then the player who hit the shot loses the point.
- If a player hits a shot that lands in the opponent's court, then spins back into their own court or into the net, the player who hit the shot wins the point.
- A player's racquet may pass over the net after hitting the ball on their own side of the net.
- A player instantly loses the point if any part of their racquet, body or clothing touches the net.
- If a ball or external object (i.e. drink bottle, score sheet, bird) interrupts play at whatever stage in a point, each player has the right to call a let. The point will then begin with the server having a first serve.
- Underarm serving is legal and the server does not need to inform their opponent they are going to serve underarm.
- If play is disrupted for any reason (e.g. rain), the match will resume from the exact score as to when the disruption occurred.
- If a server throws up a ball toss, swings, and fails to contact the ball, the serve is deemed as a fault.

23 COMPLAINTS AND RIGHT OF APPEAL

- a) Complaints or reports on breaches of these rules are to be made by Clubs (Club Captain, President or approved Interclub club contact person), by email, to the Interclub Manager within 14 days of the fixture being played. These can only be made against the team you have played. Complaints received after the 14 days will not be considered. There is an official complaint form available to download from TNR website www.tennisnorthern.co.nz. All complaints or reports must include club name, team name, grade and competition, opposing club name, date, players' full names and a clear description of the nature of the complaint. TNR will deduct points within 7 days after the Interclub Panel decision. TNR will spot check results and deduct points if a breach of the rules is discovered.
- b) The Interclub Panel will consider the complaint in the first instance and make a decision.
- c) If clubs disagree with the Interclub Panel decision, they have a right of appeal to the Judiciary arm of TNR. The appeal fee of \$200 is payable at the time of lodging the appeal. The appeal fee of \$200 will be refunded if the appeal is upheld.
- d) Clubs have a right of appeal to the Interclub Committee decisions under Rule 16 of the TNR constitution. This rule is titled "Discipline, Disputes and Appeals" and outlines the procedures for such appeals.
- e) If the Interclub Committee rules that disciplinary action is necessary the following procedure will usually be followed:
First complaint- the player concerned receives an official warning. This will be sent to the player's club captain by the Interclub Manager.
Second complaint- the player concerned will be stood down from the next interclub match after the ruling. Confirmation of the suspension will be sent to the player's club captain and team captain by the Interclub Manager.

Third complaint- the player concerned will be suspended for the season. Confirmation of this will be sent to the player's club captain and team captain by the Interclub Manager.

After each complaint it is expected that clubs will take their own disciplinary action to ensure that appropriate behaviour is displayed by club members.
